- ✓ This pick-up is for **brush ONLY**
- ✓ Brush must be bundled
- ✓ Bundles must be no more than six inches in diameter
- ✓ Bundles must be light enough for one person to lift easily
- ✓ Do not put leaves or grass clippings out for pick-up

Clearly labeled dumpsters will be provided at the Village DPW Barn on Rich Street. All items must be delivered, separated, and deposited into the correct

dumpster per the following guidelines:

✓ Each Village <a href="household">household</a> is limited to disposal of two (2) major appliances (stove, hot water heater, washer, dryer, refrigerator, etc.) Refrigerators must have doors and Freon removed prior to disposal.

- ✓ All metal must be separated and deposited into the dumpster labeled "For Metal Only."
- ✓ Proof of Village residency may be requested by anyone disposing of items. Please bring your driver's license and/or a piece of mail with you name on it delivered to your Village address.
- ✓ None of the following items may be disposed of in the dumpsters provided on cleanup days:
  - hazardous waste (including pathological and infectious wastes)
  - liquid waste (including motor oil, paints, antifreeze, pool chemicals, acids, poisons, etc.)
  - > vard waste (including leaves, limbs, trees, or stumps)
  - radioactive waste
  - > sludges
  - **demolition waste** (building materials: wood, sheet rock, shingles, tar paper, etc.)
  - > industrial waste
  - > explosives (including gas cylinders)
  - > tires
  - batteries
  - household garbage (this is to be picked up by your weekly garbage service)
  - recyclable products (newspapers, glass, cans, plastics, etc.)
