This is ONLY for seniors and those residents needing assistance with pickup. Please call Eric Lang, DPW Supervisor (206-0396) to schedule pickup.

Clearly labeled dumpsters will be provided at the Village DPW Barn on Rich Street. All items must be delivered, separated, and deposited into the correct dumpster per the following guidelines:

- ✓ Each Village household is limited to disposal of **two** (2) major appliances (stove, hot water heater, washer, dryer, refrigerator, etc.) Refrigerators *must have doors and Freon removed prior to disposal*.
- ✓ All metal must be separated and deposited into the dumpster labeled "For Metal Only."
- ✓ Proof of Village residency may be requested by anyone disposing of items. Please bring your driver's license and/or a piece of mail with you name on it delivered to your Village address.
- ✓ None of the following items may be disposed of in the dumpsters provided on cleanup days:
 - ➤ hazardous waste (including pathological and infectious wastes)
 - > liquid waste (including motor oil, paints, antifreeze, pool chemicals, acids, poisons, etc.)
 - > vard waste (including leaves, limbs, trees, or stumps)
 - > radioactive waste
 - sludges
 - **demolition waste** (building materials: wood, sheet rock, shingles, tar paper, etc.)
 - > industrial waste
 - > explosives (including gas cylinders)
 - > tires
 - batteries
 - household garbage (this is to be picked up by your weekly garbage service)
 - recyclable products (newspapers, glass, cans, plastics, etc.)
