Clearly labeled dumpsters will be provided at
the Village DPW Barn on Rich Street. All
items must be delivered, separated, and
deposited into the correct dumpster per the
following guidelines:

- ✓ Each Village household is limited to disposal of **two (2)** major appliances (stove, hot water heater, washer, dryer, refrigerator, etc.) Refrigerators ***must have doors and Freon removed prior to disposal.***
- ✓ All metal must be separated and deposited into the dumpster labeled "For Metal Only."
- ✓ Proof of Village residency may be requested by anyone disposing of items. Please bring your driver's license and/or a piece of mail with your name on it delivered to your Village address.
- ✓ None of the following items may be disposed of in the dumpsters provided on cleanup days:
 - **hazardous waste** (including pathological and infectious wastes)
 - **liquid waste** (including motor oil, paints, antifreeze, pool chemicals, acids, poisons, etc.)
 - **yard waste** (including leaves, limbs, trees, or stumps)
 - **radioactive waste**
 - **sludges**
 - **demolition waste** (building materials: wood, sheet rock, shingles, tar paper, etc.)
 - **industrial waste**
 - **explosives** (including gas cylinders)
 - **tires**
 - **batteries**
 - **household garbage** (this is to be picked up by your weekly garbage service)
 - **recyclable products** (newspapers, glass, cans, plastics, etc.)
